In each community, Africa New Life meets spiritual and physical needs through the establishment of a vibrant local church and compassionate ministry to the poor. To date, nearly 4,200 children and vulnerable women are cared for through Africa New Life. More than 1,050 new children were sponsored in 2011.

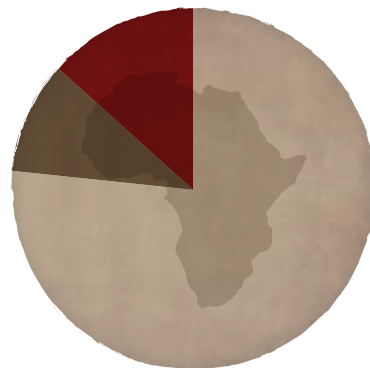

NEW LIFE CHRISTIAN ACADEMY PRIMARY SCHOOL

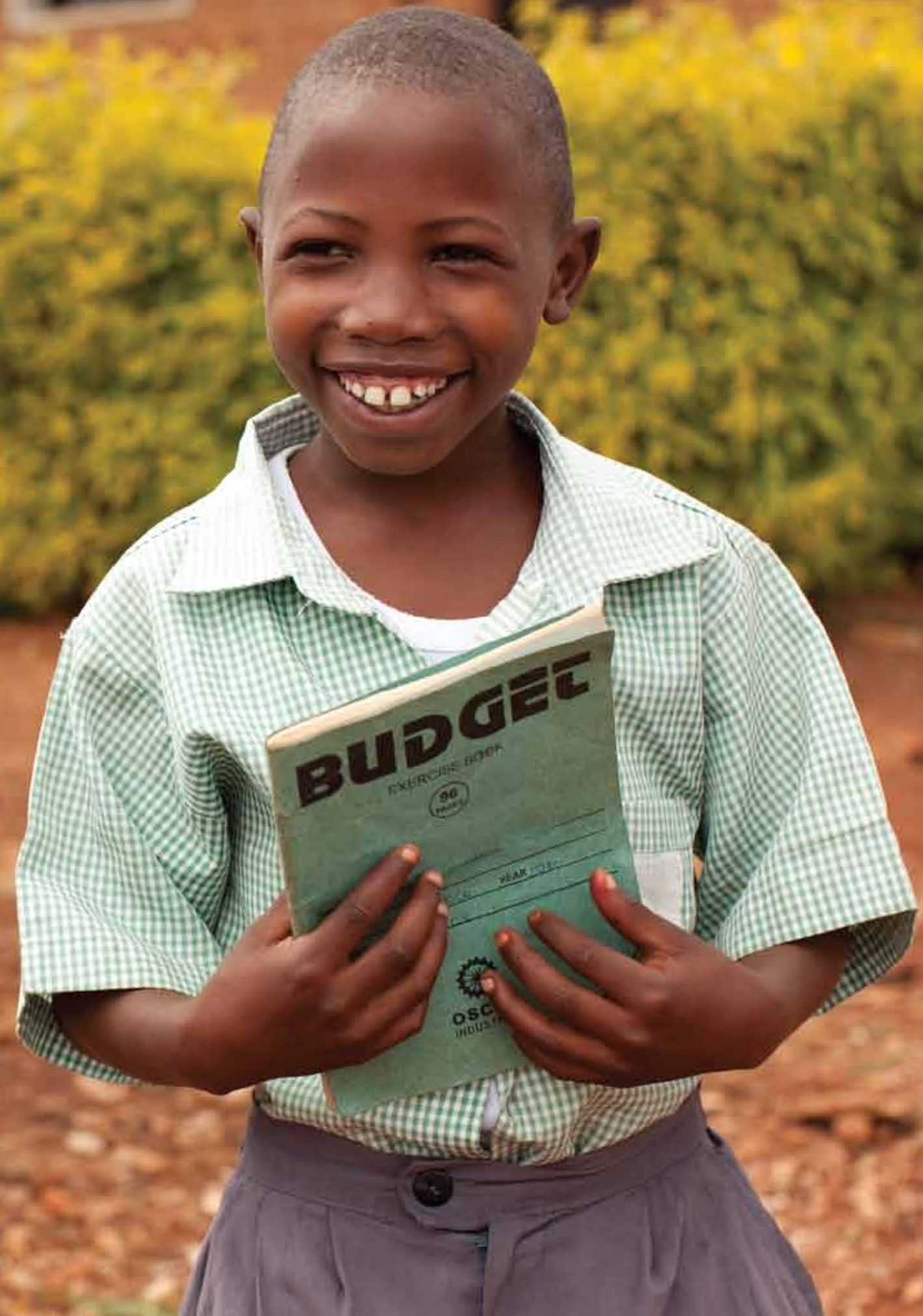
Serving 800 students, Africa New Life's flagship school tested first in its province for the fourth consecutive year and second in the nation. Three students from New Life Christian Academy are among the nation's top ten primary school students.

NEW LIFE CHRISTIAN ACADEMY SECONDARY SCHOOL

Our secondary school tested as the number one school in all of Rwanda in 2011. Two students from New Life Christian Academy are among the nation's top ten secondary school students.

DORMITORIES

A dormitory for girls was funded and constructed in 2011. In January 2012, 60 secondary-level girls moved into this new facility. A dormitory for boys was funded and will be constructed this year.



my story

NDAHIRO JOHN

John was born in Uganda in 1984. When Uganda erupted into war, John and his family fled to Zaire (now the Democratic Republic of Congo). After the genocide in Rwanda in 1994, John's family resettled in Kayonza, in eastern Rwanda. Once John had finished primary school and the first year of secondary school, his father was no longer able to afford school fees. John dropped out of school and moved to the nearby town of Rwamagana at age 14, where he found work as a houseboy. He describes this move as "a sign that I had lost hope."

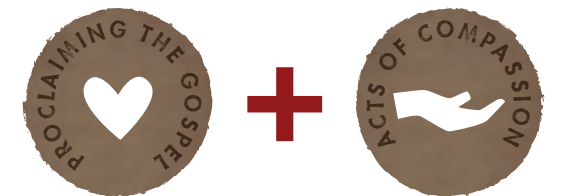
In February 2000, John came to Christ when Charles Buregeya, founder of Africa New Life, visited his community. Shortly thereafter, John told Charles he wanted to be sponsored so he could return to school. John became one of the first ten children sponsored through Africa New Life in 2001. He was sponsored by a couple in England through the RSVP program of Africa New Life in the United Kingdom.

"Life was hard for me," John says, but "when Africa New Life Ministries began to sponsor me, my life changed. Hope came. Wow, I thought, God is doing something for my future." Since 2001, four of John's family members have been sponsored through Africa New Life. The support of sponsors, John says, allowed his family to have enough food to eat. "The life of our family changed completely—all of us are educated." Today, John has a passion for preaching the gospel and will graduate from African Bible University in Uganda in 2012: "I want to reach out to many people in my country and change their lives by sharing the good news."

PRIMARY SCHOOL IN KAGEYO

Our public school, given to Africa New Life by the government to manage and freely share Christ in, became the top public school in its area. It serves more than 1,000 students.

FRESH WATER TO DRINK

In partnership with Living Water International, four wells were repaired and four new wells were drilled, providing safe water for the people of Kageyo.

MURUNGI DIANA

Diana was born in Rwanda in February 1998. Her family moved to Kageyo in 2007 when her mother, a teacher, got a job there. Her sister is also sponsored through Africa New Life, and is in preschool.

Diana was sponsored through Africa New Life several years ago, and attended school in Kageyo. In 2010, Diana tested as one of the two top female primary school students in Rwanda's national examinations, and was subsequently invited to meet Jeannette Kagame, Rwanda's first lady. Africa New Life invited her to attend secondary school at New Life Christian Academy in Kayonza.

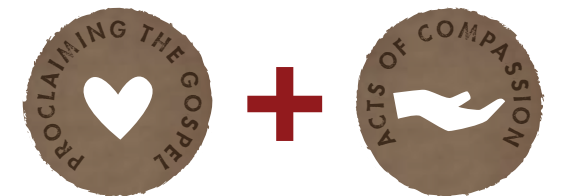

KIGALI

AFRICA COLLEGE OF THEOLOGY (ACT)

Building construction and start-up expenses are fully funded, and the first class of pastors will begin training this fall.

STREET CHILDREN MINISTRY

This ministry expanded beyond our regular feeding and discipleship of approximately 300 boys. This year 100 of these boys were able to either return to primary school or gain a vocational skill at a nationally certified training institute just down the street from our Dream Center campus in Kigali.

NEW LIFE FAMILY CENTER (NLFC)

NLFC empowered 73 destitute women to pull themselves out of poverty, providing them with an 11-month tailoring training program, while spiritually mentoring them along the way.

ESTHER HOME

Established in 2007, the Esther Home provides full-ride four-year scholarships to 11 qualified female students. This year, the second class included six young women who graduated in December 2011, all of whom have jobs.

NEW SKILLS AND LEARNING CENTER

Located on the Dream Center campus, this center opened in 2011 and now provides a long-term home for both the women and the Street Children Ministry.

BAREKE JEAN D'AMOUR

Jean is 22 years old. He lives with his mother in Kigali, and has two brothers and four sisters.

Jean started living on the street in 2003. He would collect scrap metal from the dump, and lived with his mother in a small house he likens to a toilet stall. "It is not easy to live on the streets, because you don't know if you're going to finish that day, or what you're going to eat," Jean remembers. His daily struggles included alcohol, tobacco and marijuana use.

When Jean first came to the Dream Center's Street Children Ministry, they not only gave him food but also offered advice and teaching. "It changed my life," he says. A combination of time and mentoring helped Jean give up drugs, and today he is drug-free. Jean's testimony is powerful: "If it weren't for Jesus, I couldn't have stopped taking drugs."

Jean began vocational training through Africa New Life's Street Children Ministry in May 2011. He now does contract work in domestic electric installation, which helps him afford clothing and shoes. Jean plans to continue working to sustain his family. "The lives of street children in Rwanda aren't good," he says. "If you can help these young people come off the street, God will bless you."
